

## Instructions for Final Submission

This form has been sent to you because your manuscript is ready for production. To start the copyediting and proofing process please follow the steps below and submit this Final Submission Form along with your final manuscript and supporting documents using the ESTS online submissions system.

### Delivery and Acceptance of the Work

In your final Word document please work through this list of steps:

#### 1. Reversing Anonymization

- Upload a final document that is no longer anonymized and save as: *Authorlastname\_UA\_year.docx*.
- To do this, please re-insert all references to the author(s) in the body of the text, as well as the footnotes and bibliography.

#### 2. Preferred English Language Setting

- Proof your paper once more in your preferred English language setting e.g., British English, American English, Australian English, etc.

#### 3. Images and Captions

- If your image has been cropped in Word please let us know because during the coding stage the image will uncrop. The best way to solve this is to provide the original image as a separate file.
- All images should be provided with captions. Don't forget to add a credit line for sources and permissions. Please make sure all images are saved as .PNG or .JPG files at 300 DPI with the following names: *Authorlastname\_Fig1.png*, *Authorlastname\_Fig2.png*, etc.
- Formal captions in titles are written like this:  
Figure 1. A cartographic marker appears when a shape file is drawn point-to-point (Source Author's own).

#### 4. References

- At the end of the document please title your bibliography as "References."
- Please add all DOIs to the references below, this helps your references to be found online, any other format is out of date. They should be written as links like this with a soft return for the next line:

Brown, Phil. 1992. "Popular Epidemiology and Toxic-waste Contamination: Lay and Professional Way of Knowing." *Journal of Health and Social Behaviour* 33(5): 267–281.

Here's a quick guide of things authors tend to forget:

First author is listed lastname then firstname with a comma in between.  
Lastname, Firstname, and Firstname- Lastname.

Don't forget the "and"

- All titles of the journal are in *italics* but the title of the manuscript is in parentheses "..."  
- All titles of books are in parentheses "..."  
- All book chapter titles are in parentheses "... " but the title of book is in *italics*.

DOIs are only written like this, with a soft return between the author, title, date and the DOI.  
Like this: 71–83.  
<https://doi.org/10.7532/ests2025.1245>.  
Not like this:  
71–83. doi.org.10/7532.

This is a dash and not a hyphen "–"  
(Keyboard shortcut: Option and Dash)

No space between Volume and issue numbers.  
Like this: 9(3): 71–83.  
Not this: 9.3: 71–83.  
Or 9 (3): 71–83.  
Or 9 (3) : 71–83.  
Or Vol.9 Issue 3. pp.71–83.

Lists of authors goes up to four only then you add et al.

(1) Lastname, Firstname, (2) Firstname Lastname, (3) Firstname Lastname, and (4) Firstname Lastname, et al.

Period goes inside the parenthesis regardless of type of English.  
This is a journal quirk! Like this: Justice." Not like this: Justice".

Abbreviation for no date is written as: n.d.  
If it is forthcoming write in the brackets. [forthcoming]

Title for a blog is in *italics*.

Accessed dates and modified dates are written like this:  
Accessed month day comma, year period.  
Modified month day, year.

## 5. Acknowledgements

- Please include any acknowledgements you would like published with your writing. These should be included under a separate section heading titled "Acknowledgments" at the end of the body copy, just before your References (i.e., bibliography).

## 6. Author Biographies

- For each author add a one sentence author biography between the "Acknowledgments" and "References" sections.

## 7. Permissions

- Review the final submission and confirm that the work is original except for such excerpts from copyrighted works (including illustrations, tables, animations and text quotations). Collect all necessary permissions (e.g., for use of copyrighted material) relevant to your submission.

## 8. Final Document Checklist

- Please have the following documents ready to upload to the ESTS journal management system.
  - Any permissions that you think are relevant to your submission e.g., permissions to use images. Save each document as: *Authorlastname\_Permissionso1.docx*, *Authorlastname\_Permissionso2.docx*, etc.
  - All images saved as either .png or .jpg files, at 300 DPI and name each file: *Authorlastname\_Fig1.png*, *Authorlastname\_Fig2.png*, etc.
  - Final unanonymized (UA) submission as *Authorlastname\_UA\_year.docx*.
  - A copy of this form which includes all the information requested on page 2 as *Authorname\_FinalSubmissionForm\_year.docx*.

## Uploading Your Documents to the ESTS Journal Content Management System

Follow the steps below to share your documents with the managing editor.

**Step 1:** Log-in to the ESTS journal content management system. Click on “Add discussion” in the “Copyediting” tab (Figure 1).

**Step 2:** To upload your final submission documents (see Figure 2):

3. Attach all necessary documents (see Instructions under “Delivery and Acceptance of the Work”) by clicking on “Attach” and complete the uploading process.

### Next Steps: Mark-Up, Proofs and Approval for Publishing

- Once the above information is in place your writing will be copyedited and formatted. You will be provided with either a refined or a marked-up copy of your paper depending on the level of changes that are present in this version: *Authorlastname\_ReF\_yearVo1.docx* *Authorlastname\_Mup\_yearVo1.docx*. Please proofread the page proofs including the illustrations and captions. Make all changes using track changes and send us your copyedits within two weeks of receiving the amendments as: *Authorlastname\_Mup\_yearVo2.docx*. Amendments are made to the copyeditor's version, so it is important to use track changes and comments to make amends. Authors' approval for publishing is deemed to have been given when the first author does not respond within a week of receiving the copyedits.

- Subsequently, you as author(s) will be sent a pdf version of the proofs so as to enable them to check that the manuscript has been properly set in type and to allow the author(s) to correct any typesetter's or illustrator's errors. At this stage, no alterations or corrections may be made by the author other than for the purpose of correcting typographical errors without the Publisher's prior written consent. We will request authors to approve final proofs within one week of receiving them.
- **Expect that your manuscript will go through 11 stages of copyediting between now and July 2024, please make sure you are available and let us know in advance any gaps in your schedule:**
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  - o Stage 6 Manuscript will be prepared with the author's images and any further corrections, if needed. File name is: *authorlastname\_CoR\_YearVo1.docx*.
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  - o Stage 8 Manuscript has now been stabilised and will be formatted as a PDF and an HTML file. Formatting will vary from the pdf and the html in our house style. For instance, footnotes in the pdf document will become endnotes in html. However, authors will receive proofs only in pdf format. At this stage the manuscript will be sent for coding and you will not receive any more proofs.
  - o Stage 9 Manuscript is checked by the Editorial Collective and approved by the Managing Editor and the Editor-in-Chief.
  - o Stage 10 The two files are uploaded to the content management system and the paper is added to the issue.
  - o Stage 11 The issue is approved and your writing will be individually promoted on Twitter and promoted via our newsletter and Listservs. Links will also appear on the 4S website. Please follow our Twitter account and look out for the issue sections and help us to promote all the writing as far and wide as you can.
