Subject: [Submit full dataset]

Dear [author],

Please create an account on STS Infrastructures with your full name, and upload your data artifacts indicating your full name as creator (PECE user's guide <u>here</u>, feel free to also reach out directly if you need help to do so). Feel free to ignore any fields that you aren't entirely sure what to input.

Please **email us the URLs for each artifact** once they are uploaded. You can view this <u>transcript file</u> as an example.

For each artifact in STS-I, authors also write a **"Critical Commentary."** This is usually no more than a paragraph, and it provides some context about the artifact, e.g.: What kind of thing is this? Who might be interested in this or might want to engage with it? Is there any other information about its context or creation or potential uses that you would like to share?

Ensure that the critical commentary field for every artifact is sufficiently detailed with context about the data artifact.

Please indicate in the list which of the data is **supplemental data**, and which is **source data** (source data is data that you have created yourself. See more <u>here</u> about what we mean by source data).

We hope to receive the completed items from you by [DATE] or sooner as we move closer to publication.
